Alpha Omega Welcomes UCLA's New Dental School Dean Dr. Paul Krebsbach presents

"Tuning Biomaterial Properties to Enhance Pluripotent Stem Cell Self Renewal"

ABOUT THE TOPIC

Current practices to maintain induced pluripotent stem cells (iPS) and human embryonic stem cells (hES) in an undifferentiated state typically require the support of mouse embryonic feeder cells (MEFs) or an undefined extracellular matrix such as MatrigelTM. These culture conditions that depend on animal contaminants, severely limit our ability to interpret mechanistic studies designed to resolve how human pluripotent stem cells interact with their extracellular environment to: 1) remain in a prigrap and ifferentiated state and 2) make fate changing lineage decisions. Liberaics the

unique undifferentiated state and 2) make fate-changing lineage decisions. Likewise, the xenogeneic components of MEFs and MatrigelTM will ultimately hinder our ability to use these stem cellsto treat debilitating human diseases. We have overcome these obstacles by developing a synthetic matrix system that supports iPS (and hES) cell expansion and self-renewal within completely defined culture conditions that are free from xenogeneic contamination. The establishment of this synthetic matrix now allows us to probe the molecular basis of pluripotent stem cell self-renewal and differentiation, and will pave the way for clinical applications.

r. Paul Krebsbach, one of the nation's leading researchers in tissue engineering and stem cell biology and a respected academic leader, was appointed dean of the UCLA School of Dentistry on June 30, 2016. He also holds a professor appointment in the school's Section of Periodontics. Krebsbach has been a member of the faculty at the University of Michigan since 1996. He is the Roy H. Roberts Professor of Dentistry and a professor of biomedical engineering, and he has served as chair of the department of biologic and materials sciences and division of prosthodontics since 2005. Prior to that, he was a senior staff fellow for three years at the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research, one of the National Institutes of Health Paul brings to UCLA a national reputation as an exceptional leader as well as a deep understanding of the unique mission of public research universities. The recipient of the International Association for Dental Research's 2010 Distinguished Scientist Award for Basic Research in Biological Mineralization, Krebsbach is the author of more than 180 articles and chapters, and he holds two patents. His research focuses on the cell and molecular biology of mineralized tissues and self-renewal of adult and pluripotent stem cells. He has been the principal investigator of research funded by nearly \$19.5 million in grants. For 10 years, Krebsbach served on the editorial boards of the International Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and the Journal of Bone and Mineral Research. He currently is on the editorial boards of Bone Research, the Journal of Healthcare Leadership and the International Journal of Oral Science. Krebsbach earned a bachelor's degree in biology from the University of St. Thomas, a D.D.S. from the University of Minnesota, and a doctorate in biomedical sciences and certificate in periodontology from the University of Connecticut Health Center. He is a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the American Institute for Medical and Biological Engineering, and was awarded the William J. Gies Award by the International Association for Dental Research/American Association for Dental Research and an Independent Scientist Award by the NIH and NIDCR. Earlier this year, he completed a one-year term as president of the AADR, and he is a member of the American Dental Association, the American Society for Bone and Mineral Research and the IADR.




IN MEMORIUM

2017 Ft. Lauderdale Convention Report

This year's convention was again a departure from the traditional timing and structure. The international board met on Thursday, December 28. Convention registration was the same afternoon. Both business meetings were held the next day, immediately preceding the memorial service and Shabbat dinner. Installation and awards were formally presented at the New Years Eve celebration. Dr. Steve Marsh of Cleveland, OH was installed as International president and Dr. Steve Spitz of Boston was installed as President-elect.

The current treasurer Alan Moltz of Chicago has struggled to return the fraternity to a path of fiscal sustainability. Since the dues have not changed in ten years he proposed a dues increase for active alumni members of \$18 per year. After much discussion the international board voted to defeat the proposed dues increase. At the second business meeting which followed a lunch break following the morning session a dues increase of \$5 per year for the next two years was approved by the assembled delegates.

Our executive director Heidi Weber has thoroughly investigated the city of New Orleans which has been ratified as the 2018 venue for the international convention. Beyond that the international board recommended Los Angeles as the venue for the December, 2020 convention. Heidi has also managed the roll out of the new website ao.org as a major step to improve communications for our global audience.

The next European Regency meeting is being planned for June 27-30 in Porto, Portugal.

New student chapters were announced for new dental schools at Touro (New York) and Western (Pomona, CA). Student awards were initiated at this convention recognized on Saturday morning December 30.

Meritorious service award was conferred on Michael Stern of Washington, DC. The recipient of the Achievement Medal was announced to be Dr. Robert Langer of MIT. It will be awarded in 2018 at an event in Boston so that his family, friends and colleagues can conveniently attend.




